




## 2018/2019 Program Successes + Achievements

## Early Learning Program

The program is designed for refugee/newcomer children aged 0-6 years and their caregivers who have multiple barriers to integration

- Provides more than 364 drop in sessions annually to more than 353 newcomer and refugee families
- Provides services in Willoughby, the Township of Langley and our main Langley City Centre site
- Continues to develop mutual learning and understanding between refugee families, staff and other agencies

### **Settlement & Integration Services**

The service is designed for Refugees and Newcomers and provides weekly Information Sessions, Referrals and Orientation Workshops

- Has assisted, registered and/or provided services to more than 561 clients
- Continues to increase support and programming to assist in the settlement of the newly arrived Arabic, Korean, Karen and other clients
- Provides outreach, in-home visits, family support and accompaniment to different appointments for clients
- Our programs provide services and support to youth, seniors, women and families and clients who are immigrants and/or refugees

## Community Counselling

Offers counselling to couples and individuals who are caregivers to children aged 14 years and younger

- Offering more than 1400 hours of free counselling to the community
- Provided support to more than 240 clients
- 13 counselling interns enhanced their skills at LCSS this year

### **Family Success**

Offers family therapy to families struggling with child protection concerns or family functioning challenges

 New program added to LCSS services in 2018.  June-December 2018 provided more than 290 hours of family counselling to 40 families

### **Family Connections**

Program works in close collaboration with the Ministry of Children & Family Development, providing individualized family assessments to identify strengths, supports and to work on reducing safety concerns within the family. Family Connections has three programs under its umbrella: Intensive, Family Strengthening, Family and Youth

- Service provided to 259 families dealing with child protection issues and parenting concerns. Counsellors worked with families in their homes and in the community to help them achieve goals
- Maintained close working relationship with funder Ministry of Children & Family Development that promotes minimal wait lists
- Four groups offered this year: Kids in Control, Fathers Group, Couples Communication and the Summer Family Activity Group
- Provided extra support to at risk youth upon the request of MCFD

#### Parent Outreach & Education

Confidential in-home education and counselling for families with children up to age 14

- Provided support to more than 53 families
- Developed and facilitated several 6-week programs for families based on effective parenting, enhancing connection, emotional regulation to handle anxiety, discipline and strengthening communication
- Reached over 31 clients with our parenting groups. Most popular groups this year was Taming the Worry Dragon group dealing with children's anxiety

#### Skills to Success

This is a youth employment program designed to assist youth into the labour market in BC. Eligibility is



## 2018/2019 Program Successes + Achievements

Naturalized Canadian citizen, permanent resident, confirmed refugee status or youth with disability

- Provided in class training and work force support for 38 clients
- The program had 100% success in finding a job for all the clients
- The Job Facilitator and the Job Developer have continued to forge relationships with employers in Langley and some in Surrey

### Child Care Resource & Referral

Program offers consultation, support and assistance to Langley parents seeking child care and supports child care providers through trainings, outreach, resources and networking opportunities

- 50 Educational workshops provided to 835 participants
- 533 child care referrals provided to families
- 2640 referrals provided to community
- 302 individuals accessed our lending library
- 1253 individuals helped with the Affordable Child Care Benefit
- 54 outreach support visits were made to Child Care providers

## Family Place North & South

Drop-in program for caregivers and children ages 0-6 years

- 469 sessions offered, 292 in Langley City and 177 in Willoughby
- 559 unique individuals participated
- 7355 participants visited overall
- 469 snacks provided

#### Substance Use Services

Outpatient service providing information, education, counselling and referrals for individuals attempting to change personal substance use problems

- Opened 506 individual client files with another 150 registering for services but not following through
- Started Skills for Resilience, a practical group that provides clients with skills to help manage their addiction and mental health

- Completed 12 modules of our RAW group, 12 modules of the SUMM group, 6 modules of our SOAR group and 3 modules of our Skills group
- Provided group room space for SMART Recovery to run on Tuesday evenings
- Provided an extensive number of presentations, both in schools and in the community.

### **Intensive Case Management**

Assisting eligible individuals over 19 with access to primary care services and community resources

- Received 103 referrals: 111 open files, 45 ineligible, and 41 discharged
- Provide medical, psychiatric and social support. Outreach includes but not limited to: meeting clients in community, accompanying clients to appointments/meetings, hospital visits, advocating for clients, referring clients to Substance Use programs, maneuvering traditional services with clients and housing assistance
- Housed 30 individuals in market housing
- Staff provided 3513.5 hours of Direct client Care, 270.75 hours of Professional Consultation and 551.25 hours of Case Administration, for a total of 5203.75 hours
- Develop and maintain collaborative relationships with other community service providers
- Meet regularly with Mental Health/ Homeless RCMP team

## Poverty Law Advocacy


Legal advocate works directly with clients to educate them about their legal rights and explain options for solving legal issues
